REPORTS AND OPEN DIALOGUE

A. CHAIR'S REMARKS

MADDOX will update GRC on the goings on of the Executive Board. The Board has just completed their training over this last weekend and will be meeting about their annual plan this Thursday. They will finalize their annual plan by the end of June and present it to the membership in the Fall with the new GRC term.

MADDOX mentioned about summer project for the staff and board members along GSS committees summer work.

MADDOX further added that annual plan is a major part of summer projects.

A. GRC COMMITTEE, ELECTORAL OFFICER REPORTS, UPCOMING MEETINGS AND EVENTS

• Advocacy and Campaigns: PALAPARTY/WEBB reported the Advocacy and Campaigns met April 18 to review their TOR, materials produced by a Law class on campus about creating lactation friendly spaces on campus which will be presented to UVic at the board's forthcoming Operational Relations meeting, discussed the BC Provincial Nomination Program changes, and discussed the Climate Action show-and-share meetings starting in May. TURNER discussed the committee report.

- Appeals: FIELDER noted that appeals have met and reviewed all outstanding appeals. Due to the
 recent board election, the Appeals committee has too many board members and not enough
 GRC reps on it, so they'll be seeking a new GRC rep tonight.
- Bylaw & Policy: MADDOX reported that BPC met this afternoon to discuss their summer projects, including the creation of Electoral Appeals Committee terms of reference. MADDOX said that bylaw and policy are in contradictions and working to edit the policy.
- MADDOX said that another change of bylaw clause a nonpartisan, so this will prevent people to exert their on political view
- Events: LAWTON April is quite month and petri has been on vacation. There are a whole a lot of events for the summer.
- Finance: FIELDER noted that Finance Committee has not met in April. However, our new budget
 was adopted at the SAGM as expected. Management has started work on getting our records
 ready for the annual audit.
- Stipend Review: FISCHER reported that SRC met in April to discuss the March board reports, approve top-ups to the 2023-24 board for their exemplary work, and meeting scheduling over the summer.
- Electoral Officer: QUALTER no report. QUALTER asked if the TOR would give him more workload
 for the committee. MADDOX mentioned the development of the TOR will subsidize the amount
 of workload by distributing among other committee members rather than just performed by
 QUALTERS.
- RAMANO asked if there is a possibility to waive the blackout period each year for health
 insurance. TURNER said that we are unable to get final names of the registered student until the
 end of the black out period. MADDOX added that students are covered during the blackout
 period for which you will get reimbursed for any covered medical expenses by the plan.

MADDOX said he is not invited into department meetings. Further adding graduate students must have an opportunity to participate and this could a campuswide initiative in the fall 2024.

MEETING NEW BUSINESS

1. INTRODUCTIONS TO THE 2024-25 EXECUTIVE BOARD

As the 2024-25 Board has introduced themselves and their main goals on the board repeatedly to GRC, this round of introductions focused on their individual research projects as graduate students around UVic.

PALAPARTY studies data science in the CS department

LAWTON studies PhD department of biology.

FIELDER studies in astronomy

2. FGS SUPERVISION POLICY

Lead: MADDOX Reference: For: Discussion

MADDOX gave another brief recap that the Faculty of Graduate Studies is in the process of reviewing and revising their Graduate Supervision Policy. MADDOX is the GSS representative on the committee that will revise this policy and he is looking for as much student feedback as possible from graduate students about the good, the bad, the ugly, and the wonderful about what their supervisory relationship looks like, and what policy is required to support grad student growth and success.

MADDOX requested everyone to provide feedback their graduate supervisor's experience with them.

ROBERTS asked when MADDOX is meeting. MADDOX mentioned they are in preliminary phase and there are working on the survey which will be forwarded to the supervisors. MADDOX added that this will be a long project and can take up to a year or longer to complete. MADDOX emphasised GRC Members to ask international student community and so that they are part of it as well.

MCKINNON GYM UPDATE

Lead: MADDOX Reference: For: Discussion

MADDOX provided information regarding the McKinnon weight room and dance studios, which were closed in April for renovations prior to their use for the new UVic-Canadian Sports Institute Pacific joint research project that will use those spaces exclusively for exercise science projects with CSIP. This is, of course, a significant win for our colleagues in the Exercise Science, Physical and Health Education department. However, these services were previously some of the only exercise spaces made available to all ATRS-fee paying students (ie all on campus students). UVic did not make any formal announcements before this change was made, though they had planned to, and they've since changed the language that they use to define the ATRS fee from a fee that grants students access to the McKinnon pool, weight rooms, dance studios, and CARSA squash courts, to a fee that supports all on campus student athletics. It appears that students will not be granted equivalent access at CARSA to services they've lost in McKinnon.

MADDOX discussed the student can have access to the athletic services for which they have to further pay for these services. Since the closure of the McKinnon gym will force students to join CARSA membership and which cost quite a bit. ROMANO asked if ATRS can be included into the tuition and TUENRS mentions that in 2009 the UVic wasn't able to increase tuition fee itself because of the provincial government gap and UVic added it to the UPASS program.

ROBERTS said the key problem with this situation is that lack of transparency and student aren't clear what are they getting in return for paying ATRS.

B. REPORTS FROM GRAD REPS ON UVIC COMMITTEES

LEAD: MADDOX

Open Floor to hear any reports from graduate student representatives on:

• Faculty of Graduate Studies Council:

ROBERTS mentioned the updates from Tricia Best re: International Grads: The provincial government has updated the PNP (provincial nomination program) terms, which go into effect Jan 2025. This primarily effects some Masters STEM programs, as students who were previously automatically eligible for PNP (permanent residency) will now have to secure a 1-year job offer. Furthermore, ROBERTS said some grad advisors said this is already impacting recruitment with incoming students turning down places following changes. The provincial government has not yet agreed to "grandfather" students in if they began their program before changes.

ROBERTS mentioned that a faculty member raised concerns around communicating dept. info with graduates, they said some are not reading emails/missing information. One member suggested discord. WEBB and ROBERTS raised concerns about moderating a server with all

grads- this would be time-consuming. They asked how departments might reach students (if not by email)

Senate Committee for Scholarships and Awards:

ROBERTS said the senate committee has been meeting 1 x per month and have been discussing on updating our TOR to reflect gender diversity following committee conversations. ROBERTS further added, this is a long-term project of large scale/scope and will be ongoing. ROBERTS also said that committee is meeting this week to finalize Schulich scholar nominations.

Multifaith Advisory:

ROBERTS said, we have discussed the 2025/6 AGM structure, suggestions for more representation for student clubs/campus organisations who have connection with faith/spirituality e.g. Inclusive Christians, NSU, Sikh Students Society. There were discussions about forming a student based Multifaith committee/council, but some raised concerns about timing/workload etc. for student reps. They are doing an internal hire for a new Spiritual Care Lead (co-ordinates all Spiritual Care Providers).

Furthermore, ROBERTS added one student raised issue of uneven representation for SCPs for different faith groups, e.g. there are 9 Christian/Catholic SCP's and only 2 who represent Muslim faith.
