5. REPORTS

A. MEMBERSHIP REPORT

GSS Membership: As of December 2, 2021 there are 3208 GSS Members.

GRC Membership: GRC now consists of 51 voting members: 33 academic units (out of 46 academic units eligible), and 5 Executive Board representatives.

Meeting Quorum: With 2 regrets received, quorum for tonight's meeting is 19.

C. EXECUTIVE BOARD REPORTS – QUESTIONS ARISING AND MOTION TO ACCEPT REF DOCS: Executive Board Reports September to December, 2021

MOTION: RESOLVED the Executive Board Reports for July 2021, August 2021 and October 2021 are accepted, as recommended by the Stipend Review Committee.

D. ACADEMIC UNIT & COUNCILLOR REPORTS

Breakout rooms were not used. Councillors reported to the full group, responding to questions on: GRC seat allocation and issues that are top of mind. Issues raised included: GRC seat allocation:

- Some mid-sized, primarily humanities/fine arts units felt the current model of GRC seat
 allocation worked well. These reps were concerned that smaller units could lose power by
 being out-voted if larger department got more votes. Some suggested a cap of reps per
 population so large departments don't drown out small departments.
- Some faculties felt that larger faculties should get more representation to be more
 proportional. This would also allow larger units to represent the different cohorts/programs
 and capture the diversity of grad student issues. BPC members especially felt we should
 move to representation by population.
- One rep suggested allocating seats for special interest groups like international students, programs within a department, etc.
- Some reps did not express a preference re: GRC seat allocation. Hybrid delivery to allow distance students to engage was encouraged.

Other issues:

- There was concern around the lack of rapid testing for fully vaccinated and/or asymptomatic individuals potentially exposed to COVID-19 in the last month around campus.
- There was also a desire for rapid testing as a preventative measure should capacity and supplies allow. This would allow people with cold/flu etc. symptoms to be tested and not miss valuable in-person learning opportunities.
- Immigration support for international students remains a concern especially for study permits/visas.
- COVID closures affecting lab/practice/research space access.
- Program duration is extending due to COVID and that is leaving many grad students without funding and supervisors don't have capacity to improve completion speed.
- Grad student events are particularly challenging due to delays getting responses to GSS funding applications.
- There has been disappointment about event cancellations and a desire for ways to connect on campus more once safe.

 it is required for GRC seat allocation and other GSS services.
- Communications: Is struggling to reach quorum. MILLIGAN requested members attend the meetings.
- Electoral Appeals: no report.
- Events: Did some brainstorming about events but is struggling to find a location to host events due to ban on in-person events at Halpern Centre. They are planning an orientation get together in January.
- Finance: Going well, though quorum has been an understandable issue given the pandemic, floods, etc. The next term's goals are establishing Student Advocate Fund committee and budgeting. KHAN also requested members attend to have quorate meetings.
- Stipend Review: Like other committees, quorum is an issue. DERRICK requested members attend the meetings as SRC is an important accountability mechanism for the Executive Board and GSS.
- Student Affairs: Has sent a letter regarding availability of Food and Beverage services on campus during the evenings.

F. GRADUATE REPRESENTATION ON UVIC COMMITTEES

Board of Governors: FOSTER reported BOG met in late November and the main focus is the development of UVic's new 5 year plan. There was some water damage due to the weather events in November to the new dorm building, but the construction remains on schedule.

Senate: FOSTER reported there was concerns about changing course/section designation between in-person and off-campus sections as some students were not appropriately notified of changes, especially for students on the waitlists. The Faculty Association has raised concerns about the timelines for consultation request are too tight to engage in fulsome consultation. Student senators are looking into establishing a student senate caucus to discuss priorities and emerging issues. This would allow organizations like GSS to formally contact student senators as a group. The caucus would not have a whipped vote.

APPENDIX A: CHAIR'S REMARKS

Chair's Remarks December 14, 2021

- The GSS has hired Neil Barney, a long-time office and former restaurant staff member, as our Operations and Services Manager starting in November
- The GSS has also hired two part-time unionized staff, former GSS Director of Services Daniel Gudino
 as Events Coordinator, and Melissa Wotkyns as Office/Communications coordinator, to fill Neil's previous roles
- This brings the GSS up from four staff to six (two full-time, four part time)
- The Annual General Meeting was successfully held in November, where the audited financial statements and significant bylaw changes were approved
- Unfortunately, our special guest speaker, UVic Associate VP Indigenous Robina Thomas, was not able to speak at the AGM due to technology failure, and we will be rescheduling with her
- I participated in hiring for the new UVic VP Academic, and met with all shortlisted candidates
- Nicole Kent, our Director of Communications, has put in a huge amount of work on the VP Academic search committee
- The GSS spent half a day tabling in the Quad with CUPE 4163 in November and collected numerous signatures on the petition to eliminate international student MSP
- Work is underway to develop the referendum proposals regarding the fate of the Grad House Restaurant for a vote of the GSS membership in March
- We are planning to send out a survey and hold virtual town hall meetings early in the New Year regarding the Grad House referendum
- Since the Board has committed to holding this referendum no matter what, the timeline of other projects may have to be adjusted
- The GSS Board endorsed a letter to UVic on lack of hot food service supper options on campus
- GSS Board members have participated in UVic's consultations on course mode of delivery for September 2022 and later
- There has been lack of clarity on approval process for courses where some students attend in person and some attend online (multi-access)
- UVic said at one point this would depend on being able to book two classrooms that were outfitted
 with technology for multi-access teaching, however they have recently acknowledged that these
 larger classrooms would not likely be used for graduate level courses which are typically small
- There have been some concerns around BC Transit's decision to remove posted bus schedules from bus stops, including at the UVic bus loop, as there are dead patches of wifi and not everyone has access to a mobile device
- We have heard from BC Transit that they did not post the December bus schedule due to staffing
 shortages that caused it to no longer be accurate, however they have apologized for the difficulties
 that not having a posted schedule cause for some customers, and have told us there will be a posted
 schedule again in January
- Due to off-campus COVID-19 exposures, UVic recently cancelled in-person exams and moved them online
- With the new Omicron variant spreading, it's unclear what will happen to spring courses, but the federal government's modelling is concerning

APPENDIX B: UVIC REPRESENTATION REPORTS

David Foster: Board of Governors Report December 14, 2021

- The Board of Governors met in November
- Currently a focus is on the first stages of developing UVic's strategic plan for the next five years
- Construction of residence buildings is proceeding on schedule

David Foster: Senate Report December 14, 2021

- Concerns have been raised in Senate regarding what happens when a course changes from in-person
 to online or vice versa, since this year, it resulted in some students who were waitlisted losing their
 places because they had to register in a different course code
- UVic has committed to preventing loss of waitlist spaces due to changed course modes in future
- Students and faculty have expressed some concerns about the level of consultation happening regarding course delivery modes
- The UVic Faculty Association requested that the new course delivery modes framework be discussed at the January senate meeting with a decision in February
- UVic has said the proposal will be voted on at the February Senate meeting, but it's unclear whether it will be discussed at the January meeting
- UVic student senators are interested in creating a formal Student Senate Caucus, which exists at other universities (for example, UBC) but has never existed at UVic
- So far, student senators have been meeting informally as a group to discuss the Senate agenda prior to Senate meetings, and have also had joint meetings with interested members of the Senate faculty caucus
