MEMBERSHIP REPORT, MEETING QUORUM AND ATTENDANCE 5:07

GSS Membership: As of January 21, 2025 the GSS has 3053 members.

REPORTS AND OPEN DIALOGUE

CHAIR'S REMARKS 5:10

MADDOX will update GRC on the goings on of the Executive Board.

MADDOX noted that the board has been working on elections and referendum prep. Three of our board members this year are returning to the board next year (their positions are uncontested in the election). Another board member is signed up to campaign for the referendum.

The board has also been preparing for the Semi-Annual General Meeting on March 25, 2025. The board will present bylaw amendments (see New Business Item 3 below), the 2025-26 budget, and reports from all GRC committees.

The board is also preparing for turn over. Sam and Wyatt will be training Maggie and Rosemary for their new Finance and Chair positions respectively. Maggie and Rosemary will be both receiving training and providing training to their successors in the Student Life and Internal/University Relations positions.

The Board received an update re: McKinnon pool shortly before the announcement was made public: the pool will cost \$5.1million to maintain functionality for 3-5 years. Therefore, no opportunity to keep the pool open is being explored.

The Board also received an update around graduate funding. The BC Graduate Scholarship (which provides 42 total scholarships to UVic) has increased their funding per grant marginally.

Lastly, MADDOX reported on the work that Rosemary WEBB is undertaking for advocacy to UVic regarding the implementation of their new academic accommodation policy. UVic's new policy relies heavily on universal design in learning and universal extended time for assessments in an effort to eliminate the need for "simple" accommodations at an undergrad level. At a grad level, the responsibility to negotiate accommodations was moved to the student and their supervisor. These changes limit the role of CAL and push workloads onto faculty who are not accommodation specialists.

MADDOX also advised members to file their taxes with UFile for free through the Canadian Federation of Students. TURNER reminded members that the GSS is not a CFS member organization.

TURNER gave a brief introduction to the returning board members: Jitendra PALAPARTY who returns to her External Relations position, Maggie LAWTON who will move into the Finance role, and Rosemary WEBB who will move into the Chair. Additionally, Hannah BROWN, Asma NOUREEN, and Bryn LONSBROUGH introduced themselves as candidates for the board. Iram ZAHRA provided her statement after the other guest speakers. Sarah ROBERTS declined the speaking opportunity.

GRC COMMITTEE, ELECTORAL OFFICER REPORTS, UPCOMING MEETINGS AND EVENTS 5:15

- Advocacy and Campaigns: WEBB reported that A&C discussed creating an FAQ on how to use/access Healthcare at UVic and extended benefits to be posted on the GSS website. Additionally, Yasmeen has proposed and already run the first queer BIPOC social. Updates on Advocacy for Inclusive Recreation (AIR) include that Monday nights are climb nights, Yoga with SSD got great feedback, a self-defence program has been proposed with the Native Students Union, and Every Body Wiggle (open, accessible dance classes) are looking to rebrand and increase advertising.
- Appeals: FIELDER reported that no appeals were filed for review in February.
- Bylaw & Policy: MADDOX reported that BPC reviewed and approved revised Financial Policies, alongside Finance Committee. These policies will now go to the Board for approval and then become part of the GSS policy manual. The revision to bylaw 15 (non-partisanship) is still ongoing.
- Events: LAWTON reported that Events Committee has planned all March events. There will be two ticketed events: Mug painting and a trip to the Bug Zoo. Tickets available in the front office. The end of term party has been scheduled for March 28. For February events, despite losing their first pub (Grad House due to a water heater breakdown), the Valentines pub crawl went very well!
- Finance: FIELDER reported that the Finance Com. reviewed and approved revised Financial Policies, including a Budget Policy, and Terms of Reference for all GSS funds/bank accounts.
- Stipend Review: TURNER reported that SRC reviewed all submitted board reports. One
 report was not received, which is noted in the board stipend motion below. The SRC also
 reviewed the board stipend rates for 2025-26 that will be approved at the Semi-Annual
 General Meeting next month.
- Electoral Officer: QUALTER reported that nominations closed for the board yesterday, February 24 at 4pm. Three seats are uncontested: Chair, filled by Rosemary Webb; External Relations, filled by Jitendra Palaparty; and Finance, filled by Maggie Lawton. These seats will be ratified at the SAGM on March 25. The position of Director of Student Life received two

nominees: Bryn Lonsborough and Asma Noureen. The position of Director of Internal/University Relations received three nominees: Sarah Roberts, Iram Zahra, and Hannah Brown. QUALTER reminded members that the Meet the Candidates event would take place tomorrow, February 26 in Side Project 9-10am. They also reminded members to vote March 5-7 on Simply Voting for both the Director of Internal/University Relations and Director of Student Life and the Health and Dental referendum.

1. LIBRARY CONSULTATION 5:40

Karen Munro and Courtney Lundrigan will bring updates on library services and programs, and will ask a couple of quick questions to get reps' input.

MUNRO and LUNDRIGAN provided an overview of the following services: two library locations (Priestly Law Library and McPherson Library); Tek Booths; Grad Student Writing space; Thesis Writing Intensive; Research Librarians by subject matter; Digital Scholarship Commons; rental equipment; bike lockers, etc. They also solicited feedback on a current student survey.

MUNRO asked after thesis formatting as it relates to the Thesis Writing Intensive. GARO has recently ended their formatting assistance for theses, so there will be an increased need for formatting help and technologies from the Library. Several GRC reps mentioned specific tech and tools that are high demand and pay-for-service that they'd like the Library to offer. MUNRO referred students to the Digital Scholarship Commons as well for tech and tools support.

2. CAREER EDUCATOR INTRODUCTION 6:05

Samantha OGRODNIK has a 1 year term position to offer career education services to grad students. Please, ask her questions, refer soon-to-be-grads to her, tell your friends!

OGRODNIK provided an overview of her role and requested feedback on how best to reach graduate students in need of career advising, including the format and frequency of campus engagements, format of online supports, appointment booking systems, etc.

OGRODNIK noted that her services are for both academic and non-academic jobs and across all disciplines. She can provide assistance with resumes, CV, cover letters, interview practices (including scholarship interviews and co-op interviews). She can provide one-on-one in-person or online appointments, forthcoming workshops on CVs vs resumes, academic vs non-academic job hunting, etc. You can find Sam in the GSS board room on Mondays 10-12 for drop-in support.

OGRODNIK also asked for GRC reps to fill out her survey that has been circulated via GSS bulletin and Instagram. BROWN asked if the workshops will be recorded and available online.

3. BYLAW AMENDMENTS 6:20

MADDOX presented on bylaw amendments to bylaws 4.4 (Referenda), 14.3 (Membership Fees) and 14.4 (Funds of the Society). These changes are administrative and record ongoing practice for which fees increase by the Consumer Price Index annually (14.3) and requiring any future fee referendum to include whether the fee increases by CPI or not (4.4). Additionally, they allow for the GSS to seek additional public donations and government/non-governmental agency grants (14.4). These changes will be voted on at the Semi-Annual General Meeting on March 25, 2025.

- Too many courses, impacting completion rates

- Reduced units to come in line with other MA programs in the faculty
